

# FOLLOW THE MAZE TO SEE HOW A BILL BECOMES A LAW

start

A Senator or Representative introduces a bill

The bill moves to a Joint Committee for review

If the Committee passes the bill, it goes to the chamber of the legislature that introduced the bill

The bill is voted on by the members of the chamber

If the bill passes, it goes to the other chamber for debate

The other chamber votes on the bill

If the bill is not passed in the same form, it is sent to the conference committee where it's changed to a form both chambers agree on

If the bill is passed in both the Senate and the House in the same form, it is sent to the Governor

The bill is then sent to the Governor

The Governor can sign or veto the bill

If the Governor signs the bill, it becomes law

If the Governor vetoes the bill, it is dead unless the Legislature overrides the veto by 2/3's vote of both chambers
